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NEWBURY BOARD OF SELECTMEN MINUTES OF OCTOBER 06, 2014 MEETING

Selectmen: Richard Wright, Gary Budd and Ed Thorson.

The meeting convened at 6:00 p.m.

PUBLIC INPUT:

None.

APPOINTMENTS:

Amy Sherman a resident in Newbury asked for November 2014 to be Pancreatic Cancer Awareness month. She spoke of her volunteer work she does for the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network and how her dad had passed from pancreatic cancer. The board signed a proclamation making November 2014 Pancreatic Cancer Awareness month in the town of Newbury and presented it to Amy.

NEW BUSINESS:

Pavlicek said Woodchuck day would be October 25, 2014 at 8:00 a.m., the board agreed. We will advertise in the Kearsarge shopper and put up posters. There will be breakfast that morning. Wright suggested that we need more log splitters, maybe rent from Lumber Barn or ask residents if they can borrow log splitters.

The Code Enforcement Position will be posted in October. Paul LaCasse will be leaving at the end of the year but is willing to stay and help train if needed. Budd said we should advertise soon as to have sufficient time to train. Ad will be in Shopper and Concord Monitor.

Pavlicek read a letter from Jason Bell of Bell Excavating, stating that they had completed the work that needed to be done on Greystone Lane and Summer Street as required by the town to accept the roads as town roads. Cal Prussman, highway administrator has inspected the roads. Wright asked for a motion, Thorson made a motion, Budd second the motion and accepted the roads as town roads. Pavlicek will send letter.

Pavlicek read a letter from Ralph Littlefield regarding the senior housing and the two bonds being held. He stated now that Newbury Heights Road is complete he wants to terminate the bonds. Bruce Healey's sent in a letter from the planning board suggesting they terminate the on-site bond but keep the performance bond. There is a year guarantee and the bonds are up in April so the Board decided to terminate both bonds. All agreed. Pavlicek will notify Littlefield.

Letter from NH the Beautiful saying there will be a press release in the Intertown about the \$150 we received for the barrels at the transfer station.

Pavlicek told the board of a letter from Attorney Rouvalis, who represents a resident on Great Island requesting under the right to know act, the conservation committee minutes on a thumb drive and any paperwork that was brought to that meeting. Also Lindsey Holmes had requested a copy of the thumb drive.

Pavlicek read a letter from Amanda Prussman asking for sponsorship for the Chocolate Festival being held on Mt. Sunapee this year. The board declined.

Planet Aid approached Pavlicek regarding putting a collection box at the transfer station. Budd was in favor of doing it, Thorson and Wright had concerns about how much Planet Aid gives to those in need and what if any profit Planet Aid makes. Also the issue of picking up the clothes they have been donated. Budd will look into more information about Planet Aid.

Judy Healey and Joy Nowell are helping to organize the employee holiday party. Bubba's will supply some of the food. The luncheon will be December 17, 2014.

Pavlicek read a letter from resident, Brenda Digilio asking to waive the building permit fee of \$346 for a barn. They are trying to move the Baker Hill cart barn that they are tearing down across from their lot. It is an old historic barn from the 1800's and has been in the Digilio family for 80 years. They board decided not to waive the fees.

There was a request from Chief Robert Lee regarding the mandatory harassment meeting. (He would like to be excused from this meeting since he already attended a harassment meeting that was mandated by the board and believes that this would be redundant for him.) The board denied his request. They believe it is a good team building exercise and as a manager he needs to attend.

There was a notice of the agenda for the school district meeting on Tuesday the 7th.

Conservation Committee is having a meeting on October 28th, 2014 at 7:30 p.m. at the Newbury town offices regarding the Concord Sunapee Rail Trail.

Pavlicek read a letter from Jay Wragg regarding the well pumps at Fisherfield. The board is in favor of going with the 2hp pump. Pavlicek will call tomorrow to get the price difference from the original quote.

INTENT TO CUT: A cut in the buffer zone for Thomas Hill, Map/Lot #06-083-129 was approved and signed.

NON-PUBLIC SESSION:

The Board voted to go into non-public session under RSA 91-A:3, II, a-e at 6:41 p.m. to discuss a personnel matter. The board came out of non-public at 6:53 p.m.

PAYROLL & ACCOUNTS PAYABLE: Week ending October 4, 2014 were approved and signed.


